

I Have Been-Redeemed,

Defined:

Repurchase of captured goods or prisoners; the act of buying the deliverance of persons or things from the possession and power of captors by the payment of an equivalent; ransom.

I Have Been-Redeemed

Defined: (as used in the Bible):

- It was used in legal matters regarding possessions. Ex. 21:28-32; Lev. 25:25-29
- Attached is the idea of deliverance. Gen. 48:16
- The combined literal usage with the religious usage found in the O.T. helps us understand the concept of redemption throughout the Bible.
 (1 Cor. 6:20 – "You were bought with a price")

I Have Been-Redeemed

Defined: (as used in the Bible):

In the Old Testament:

- Redemption price for the firstborn in Israel -Num. 3:39-43, 46-51
- Jews redeemed from slavery to foreign nations – Neh. 5:8
- Delivered from Egyptian slavery Deut.9:26
- "You sold yourselves for nothing, and you shall be redeemed without money" Isa.
 52:3

I Have Been-Redeemed

Defined: (as used in the Bible):

In the New Testament

- Man in sin a slave >>>>In Christ, FREE (Jn. 8:32-36; Rom. 6:3, 16-18)
- Man, Because of Sin Guilty >>>> In Christ, Forgiven – (Rom. 3:23-24)

Man. outside of Christ cursed >>>>In Christ. Blessed And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." They answered Him, "We are Abraham's descendants, and have never been in bondage to anyone. How can You say, 'You will be made free'? Jesus answered them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin. And a slave does not abide in the house forever, but a son abides forever. Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.

I Have Been-Redeemed

1 Chronicles 17:20-22

²⁰ O LORD, there is none like You, nor is there any God besides You, according to all that we have heard with our ears. ²¹ And who is like Your people Israel, the one nation on the earth whom God went to <u>redeem</u> for Himself as a people--to make for Yourself a name by great and awesome deeds, by driving out nations from before Your people whom You <u>redeemed</u> from Egypt?
 ²² For You have made Your people Israel Your very own people forever; and You, LORD, have become their

God.

I Have Been-Redeemed,

1 Peter 1:18-23

¹⁸ knowing that you were not <u>redeemed</u> with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot. ²⁰ He indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you.

I Have Been-Redeemed

1 Peter 1:18-23

²¹ who through Him believe in God, who raised Him from the dead and gave Him glory, so that your faith and hope are in God. ²² Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart, ²³ having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever...



I Have Been-Redeemed

Eph. 1:7 - ⁷ In Him we have <u>redemption</u> <u>through His blood</u>, the <u>forgiveness of</u> <u>sins</u>, according to the riches of His grace...

Col. 1:13-14 - ¹³ He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, ¹⁴ in whom we have <u>redemption through</u> <u>His blood, the forgiveness of sins</u>.

Matt. 20:28 - ²⁸ just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many.


I Have Been-Redeemed Heb. 9:11-26 Jesus, our High Priest – entered the most holy place having obtained eternal redemption – (11-12) A spotless sacrifice, far superior to the blood of bulls and goats, enabling Him to be Mediator of the N.C. – (13-15) The N.C. which provided remission of sins required the shedding of innocent blood – (16-22) Appears before the Father as the perfect sacrifice which He offered for our sins – (23-26)

I Have Been-Redeemed



Heb. 10:1-18

- The power of His sinless life and free will offering of Himself for us – (1-10)
- The free will offering of Jesus provided the means through which man can – have his "sins taken away" – be "sanctified" – be "perfected" – have "sins remembered no more" – have "remission" – can "enter the Holiest" - (11-22)
