

RELEVANCY OF THE OLD PATHS

Jeremiah's Ministry



- Judah had rejected the Lord for idols (2:13,32; 5:19; 19:4-5)
- Guilty of gross personal unrighteousness (5:1,7-8,25-28; 6:13).
- They hypocritically claimed to be God's people (5:2; 7:9-11)



RELEVANCY OF THE OLD PATHS

Jeremiah: A priest from the Benjamin just a few miles northeast of Jerusalem.

Jeremiah's prophecies Baruch, his scribe (36:4,27-28,32).

RELEVANCY OF THE OLD PATHS Jeremiah's Ministry They refused to hear God's Word (6:16-19; 7:25-26; 25) They refused to be corrected (5:3,21; 6:15; 17:23; 44:15-18) Followed false prophets who spoke what the people wanted to hear (5:30-31; 6:14)



RELEVANCY OF THE OLD PATHS

Jeremiah's Ministry

- Called Judah to repent (3:1; 7:4-7)
 - They refused (6:16-17; 20:1-2; 32:2-5; 37:11-21; 38:1-13)
- He foretold their destruction (5:9-10,14-18,29; 6:22-26; 7:16)

Israel was to be so destroyed as a nation that they could never be made whole again (19:10-11)

RELEVANCY OF THE OLD PATHS

Rubel Shelly

"The Spirit of God is still moving and acting in the church today and we must be more open to it. The result will be exhilarating changes in the worship and mission of the church. <u>It has been a mistake to emphasize 'the old</u> <u>paths'</u> because we need to be open to change. . . . "The church has got to change. If it doesn't change, my kids are not going to stay with it. I'm probably not going to stay with it... Mine was the last generation that would tolerate indoctrination."
